Aside from the increased danger posed by high speed driving, decelerating will keep money in your pocket.

Removing the roof racks from your car will improve your gas consumption, so take it off if you're not going to be using it. In addition to adding weight to your automobile, roof racks raise the drag, both dragging down your fuel efficiency. It may not save you a huge amount, but there is no reason to lug around excess weight in your trunk without it being a necessity. Gas prices don't look set to fall meaningfully, so either learn to live with it or search for alternative fuel sources while finding ways to cut back on your usage. It's tough to get people to do more than just complain, and so the many continue in their usual ways and simply pay the higher costs.
